The earliest-known recording of a human voice is a crackly performance of Claire de Lune from 1860: the sound was rendered as a wavy line on soot-covered paper by Edouard-Leon Scott de Martinville's 'phonautograph'. It was never intended to be heard but, in 2008, researchers at the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory were able to recover the distorted but recognisable performance.

Listening to this in today's high-fidelity, ubiquitously-recorded world, it sounds otherworldly, but 6th April 1860 was a day like any other. The buildings, the fashions, the discourse would have been different, but people are people, with lives shaped by the places, times and circumstances in which they lived:

we are them, and they are us. Old photos and old recordings might sometimes seem like they are from another world, but they are not: our experiences become our memories, and we must keep them alive.

The heritage of AKS stretches across three hundred years of history at our legacy schools, and the threads that link our current students with our alumni are as compelling as they are vital. It is my pleasure, then, to welcome you to this edition of the OAKS Magazine, as we celebrate once again our remarkable community both past and present.

Arnold School and now AKS.



The jubilee weekend started in style as two of our alumni tied the knot.



OUR HERITAGE

The history of our school spans around 300 years, and an estimated 15000 alumni, across the three main heritage schools that have combined to form AKS.

All of the schools shared a fundamental moral purpose of providing educational opportunities for children in the area, combining academic rigour and character education with a spirit of service within their communities and beyond, a core thread that runs through the school as it is now.

Many students were beneficiaries of the Direct Grant scheme, which enabled the core purpose of being schools for the local community to benefit many students over a number of years.

Given the centrality and prominence of the founding schools to the Fylde Coast and Blackpool communities over the past century, the heritage of these institutions remains as important as ever.

King Edward VII School

King Edward's, a day school for local boys, was founded in 1908, and is the site upon which AKS is situated. Its motto Sublimis Ab Unda ('Raised from the Waves') echoes a devastating 1719 flood which led to the establishment of the Lytham Schools Foundation, which in turn ultimately developed and funded the original school. Although the preliminary plans to build a boarding school ultimately never reached fruition, the grand buildings and extensive grounds form a striking site.

Arnold School

Named after Dr Thomas Arnold, Headmaster of Rugby from 1828 to 1841, what was originally known as Arnold House School was founded in Blackpool in 1896 with the motto Honor Virtutis Praemium ('Honour is the Reward of Virtue').

Queen Mary School

QMS was founded in 1930, and its founding head, Doris Bailey, was a champion of progressive, globally-focused schooling, fighting to ensure that the educational opportunities offered to girls matched those available to boys at King Edward's and elsewhere.

KEQMS

Over the period 1999 to 2004, King Edward's at QMS merged to form King Edward and Queen Mary's School, with the buildings from QMS being sold. This move brought together two long-affiliated single-sex schools onto one site.

AKS Lytham

AKS Lytham was formed in 2012 from the merger of KEQMS and Arnold, at which point it joined the United Learning group of schools.


